The program educates individuals about the warning signs that can identify potential abuse before it happens. Also, if adults know the warning signs, we do not have to rely solely on a child to report an incident. The program is intended to raise one's awareness of other people's behavior as well as their own behavior in order to avoid a "lapse of judgement". Advocates of embryonic stem cell research often use diabetes as an example of a disease that their unethical research will cure some day. California has even set aside taxpayer money to fund this immoral medical approach. How ironic, then, that in California the La Jolla Institute for Allergy and Immunology is set to begin a vaccine-based treatment of Type I diabetes in humans before the end of this year. This is yet another example of how medical research if coming up with ethical treatments of devastating diseases at a time when embryonic stem cell research has yet to produce and usable results.
